

In the County Court of Fairfax County, May Court 1863

In the matter of the application of Joseph Janney for leave to establish a Ferry at Occoquan, he having made his application according to Law, the Court doth order as follows:

Notice having been published by Joseph T. Janney according to law at the front door of the Court House of this County of his intention to make application for the privilege of establishing a Ferry across Occoquan River, at or near the Village of Occoquan, the Court doth order that the Sheriff summon all the seating Justices of the County to attend the next Term of this Court to consider the propriety of granting to the said Joseph T. Janney the right to establish a Ferry in accordance with said Notice and application.

In the County Court of Fairfax County, June Court 1865

In the matter of the application of Joseph Janney for leave to establish a Ferry at Occoquan, all the acting Justices of the Peace having been summoned to act upon your application, present – Thomas P. Brown P. J., Daniel M. Lewis, James Rice, Levi Deming, Samuel Pulman, Wm. A. Ferguson, E. E. Mason, Reuben \_\_ and Henry Brady as Justices.

The privilege to establish said Ferry is granted by the court. At said Ferry one boat is to be used 35 feet long 15 feet wide with capacity of 22 horses and the number of hands to be employed one.

The following are the rates of Ferriage established for said Ferry by the county Court of Fairfax County to Wit:

For ferrying across one horse and man, or woman	.10
For ferrying across one man or woman	.05
For ferrying across one horse team including driver	.25
For ferrying across one horse team including driver	.35
For ferrying across two horse team including driver	.25
For ferrying across four horse team including driver light	.50
For ferrying across four horse team including driver loaded	.75
For ferrying across meat cattle per head	.05
For ferrying across beef cattle per head	.05
